Original and revised Pages as named below comprise all changes from the original price list and are currently in effect as of the date of the bottom of this page.

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APPLICATION OF TARIFF

This tariff applies to intrastate access service supplied to customers for origination and termination of traffic to and from Central Office codes assigned to Comcast Phone of Maryland, Inc. (d/b/a Comcast Communications of Maryland, Inc.)

Compensation for the exchange of local traffic is not governed by the rates, terms and conditions set forth in this tariff. To the extent compensation is appropriate, the Company will enter into a mutually binding agreement (subject to the Commission's review and approval, where required) with the requesting company setting forth the terms and conditions of that compensation. Where no such agreement has been entered into, the Company will exchange local traffic on a "bill and keep" basis. To the extent another company demands payment based upon tariffed rates for the transport and termination of local traffic, the Company reserves the right to assess those same rates on a reciprocal basis.

EXPLANATION OF SYMBOLS

C	To signify a changed regulation.
R	To signify a reduction in a rate.
I	To signify an increase in a rate.
T	To signify a change in text but no change in rate or regulation.
S	To signify a reissued matter.
M	To signify text or rates relocated without change.
N	To signify a new rate or regulation.
D	To signify a discontinued rate or regulation.
Z	To signify a correction

TARIFF FORMAT

A. Page Numbering:

Page numbers appear in the upper right corner of the page. Pages are numbered sequentially. However, new pages are occasionally added to the tariff. When a new page is added between pages already in effect, a decimal is added. For example, a new page added between pages 14 and 15 would be 14.1.

B. Page Revision Numbers:

Revision numbers also appear in the upper right corner of each page. These numbers are used to determine the most current page version on file with the Commission. For example, the 4th revised Page 14 cancels the 3rd revised Page 14. Because of various suspension periods, deferrals, etc. the Commission follows in the tariff approval process, the most current page number on file with the Commission is not always the tariff page in effect. Consult the Check Sheet for the page currently in effect.

C. Paragraph Numbering Sequence:

There are seven levels of paragraph coding. Each level of coding is subservient to its next higher level:

- 2.1.1.
- 2.1.1.A.
- 2.1.1.A.1.
- 2.1.1.A.1.(a).
- 2.1.1.A.1.(a).I.

D. Check Sheets:

When a tariff filing is made with the Commission, an updated check sheet accompanies the tariff filing. The check sheet lists the pages contained in the tariff, with a cross-reference to the current revision number. When new pages are added, the check sheet is changed to reflect the revision. All revisions made in a given filing are designated by an asterisk (*). There will be no other symbols used on this page if these are the only changes made to it (i.e., the format, etc. remains the same, just revised revision levels on some pages). The price list user should refer to the latest check sheet to find out if a particular page is the most current on file with the Commission.

1 - DEFINITIONS

1.0 DEFINITIONS

Certain terms used generally throughout this tariff are described below.

Advance Payment: Part or all of a payment required before the start of service.

Access Services: The Company's intrastate telephone services offered pursuant to this tariff.

Company or Comcast: Comcast Phone of Maryland, Inc., d/b/a Comcast Digital Phone the issuer of this tariff.

Customer: The person, firm or corporation which orders service and is responsible for the payment of charges and compliance with the Company's regulations.

End Office: With respect to each NPA-NXX code prefix assigned to the Company, the location of the Company's "end-office" for purposes of this tariff shall be the point of interconnection associated with that NPA-NXX code in the Local Exchange Routing Guide, issued by Bellcore.

End User: A person or entity that subscribes to any Company Exchange Access Service offered under the Company's Maryland P.S.C. No. 3 Tariff, Section 5, and that has been assigned one or more telephone number(s) within a central office code (NPA-NXX) directly assigned to the Company.

LATA: A Local Access and Transport Area established pursuant to the Modification of Final Judgment entered by the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in Civil Action No. 82-0192; or any other geographic area designated as a LATA in the NATIONAL EXCHANGE CARRIER ASSOCIATION, INC. TARIFF F.C.C. NO. 4, or by any other appropriate means.

1 - DEFINITIONS

1.0 DEFINITIONS (CONT'D)

Rate Center: A building in which one or more central offices, used for the provision of Exchange Services, are located, and used as a location for the rating of distance-sensitive charges.

Recurring Charges: The monthly charges to the Customer for services, facilities and equipment which continue for the agreed upon duration of the service.

Service Commencement Date: The first date on which the Company notifies the Customer that the requested service or facility is available for use, unless extended by the Customer's refusal to accept service which does not conform to standards set forth in the Service Order or this tariff, in which case the Service Commencement Date is the date of the Customer's acceptance. The Company and the Customer may mutually agree on a substitute Service Commencement Date. If the Company does not have an executed Service Order from a customer, the Service Commencement Date will be the first date on which the service or facility was used by a customer.

Service Order: The written request for access services executed by the Customer and the Company in the format devised by the Company. The signing of a Service Order by the Customer and acceptance by the Company initiates the respective obligations of the parties as set forth therein and pursuant to this tariff, but the duration of the service is calculated from the Service Commencement Date. Should a customer use the Company's access service without an executed Service Order, the Company will then request the customer to submit a Service Order.

Serving Wire Center: The wire center from which the customer-designated premises would normally obtain dial tone from the Company.

Shared: A facility or equipment system or subsystem that can be used simultaneously by several Customers.

User: A Customer or any other person authorized by the Customer to use service provided under this tariff.
