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1. APPLICATION AND REFERENCE

1.1 APPLICATION

This Tariff applies to intrastate Telecommunication Service provided by **COMCAST PHONE OF MICHIGAN, LLC** with a certified license to operate in exchanges and zones within the state of Michigan, regulated by and subject to the terms and conditions of this Tariff on file with the Michigan Public Service Commission (“MPSC”) under the provision of Article 3 of the Michigan Telecommunication Act (“MTA”) (1991 PA 179). (Certain terms used generally throughout this tariff are defined in 2.1.1, following.)

1.4 TARIFF FORMAT

1.4.1 LOCATION OF MATERIAL

- A. Section 1 provides the following for all of the sections in this Tariff:
- Subject Index - an alphabetical listing to find the desired section.
 - Table of Contents - A numerical listing to find the desired section and page.
- B. Each individual section in the Tariff provides a Subject Index for the material located within that section.

1.4.2 SHEET NUMBERING

Sheet numbers appear in the upper right corner of the sheet. Sheets are numbered sequentially. However, new sheets are occasionally added to the Tariff. When a new sheet is added between sheets already in effect, a decimal is added. For example, a new sheet added between sheets 14 and 15 would be 14.1.

1.4.3 SHEET REVISION NUMBERS

Revision numbers also appear in the upper right corner of each sheet. These numbers are used to determine the most current sheet version on file with the Commission. For example, the 4th revised Sheet 14 cancels the 3rd revised Sheet 14. Because of various suspension periods, deferrals, etc., the Commission follows in their tariff approval process, the most current sheet number on file with the Commission is not always the tariff sheet in effect. Consult the Check Sheets for the sheet currently in effect.

1.4 TARIFF FORMAT (Cont'd)

1.4.4 PARAGRAPH NUMBERING SEQUENCE

There are nine levels of paragraph coding. Each level of coding is subservient to its next higher level:

1.4.5 RATE TABLES

Within rate tables, four types of entries are allowed:

- Rate Amount

The rate amount indicates the dollar value associated with the rate or charge for service.

- A dash "-"

The dash indicates that there is no rate for the service or that a rate amount is not applicable under the specific column header.

- A footnote designator "[1]"

The footnote designator indicates that further information is contained in a footnote.

- ICB

The acronym "ICB" indicates that the product/service is rated on an Individual Case Basis.
